Road Network Information

A21 Farnborough Way, Green Street Green pedestrian crossing and bus stop upgrade

Transport for London (TfL) has appointed EM Highway Services Limited, to carry out highway improvement works to install two new pedestrian crossings along A21 Farnborough Way/Sevenoaks Road near its junctions with Green Street Green roundabout. To ensure the safety of those using the road, traffic management will be put in place during the

works.

Why are we doing this work?

The scheme involves build outs of the kerb and central islands, footway widening, upgrading existing bus stops, installation of uncontrolled pedestrian crossings on A21 Farnborough Way and Sevenoaks Road. The completed works will bring benefits by providing improved facilities for pedestrians in the area.

What times will the work take place?

The footway works will be carried out during the daytime planned to begin on **Monday 14 July 2013 for approximately 7 weeks** or until the work is completed. In agreement with the London Borough of Bromley, the working hours will be from **08:00 to 17:00**, **Monday to Friday**.

The bus stop improvement works will take place overnight between 21:00 to 05:00 from mid-August for approximately 3 weeksor until the work is completed.

What we would like you to know

As with all works on the Transport for London Road Network, we must balance possible disruption to residents with disruption to traffic. Working during the day and night provides us with the best chance to complete these works safely and as quickly as possible whilst minimising disruption.

Access for emergency services will be maintained at all times during the works.

Every effort will be made to undertake all footway works during day time hours allowing pedestrian movement where possible. A number of pedestrian crossing points maybe closed to facilitate the footway works, pedestrians will be directed to the nearest crossing points.

Keeping London moving

Transport for London is firmly committed to minimising disruption. We have worked closely with our contractor, EM Highway Services and the London Borough of Bromley in order to reduce the impact of these works on road users, local residents and businesses as far as possible.

I hope you will appreciate that a certain level of disruption is inevitable, and I apologise in advance for any inconvenience that may be caused as a result of these essential works.
